

Project Location Plan (not to scale)





Project Location Plan (not to scale)



Please find the Stage I and II Archaeological Assessments provided via the temporary file sharing link provided in the email accompanying this letter for your reference.

As noted in previous correspondence, the Stage I Archaeological Assessment was completed to provide a baseline level of data on known and potential cultural heritage resources within the project limits and to delineate the archaeological potential of the area. The findings of the Stage I Archaeological Assessment warranted the undertaking of a Stage II Archaeological Assessment which conducted a test pit survey in order to determine the presence or absence of archaeological materials within the project limits.

The Archaeological Assessments were completed in accordance with the *Ontario Heritage Act* and, ultimately, cleared the project site of any archaeological concerns. The Archaeological Assessments have been submitted and accepted by the Ontario Ministry of Citizenship and Multi-Culturalism.

As the project lands have been cleared of archaeological concerns, and the proposed use of the project lands is consistent with its current one (a roadway), the impact to heritage and cultural aspects is expected to be minimal.

We request that Huron-Wendat consider the clearance of the project site of any archaeological concerns, and confirm if review efforts are still believed to be appropriate/warranted.



Angeline Street North Reconstruction, City of Kawartha Lakes

Dear Chief Simpson:

As identified through previous notices, Ainley Group (AG) and the City of Kawartha Lakes (CKL) are completing a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) process in support of reconstruction of Angeline Street North in Lindsay, ON.

The project proposes the reconstruction of Angline Street North, generally from Roosevelt Street to Colborne Street West, to accommodate projected traffic volumes along the corridor. The project is being completed as a Schedule 'B' activity through the MCEA process. Public Information Centre (PIC) #2 for the project was conducted on May 9, 2024, which presented a Preliminary Preferred Alternative for the roadway's reconstruction. The presentation materials from PIC #2 provide a comprehensive summary of the project and progress to date with respect to the MCEA process. Alderville First Nation's (AFN) review of the presentation materials is requested to establish a foundational understanding of the project and better facilitate consultation efforts. The PIC #2 presentation materials are provided via a temporary file-sharing link within the email accompanying this letter, and are also publicly available through the following web address:

https://www.kawarthalakes.ca/en/municipal-services/major-projects.aspx

Submission of the MCEA's Project File Report to CKL's City Council is planned for Spring 2025, and timely correspondence to help us achieve this timeline would sincerely be appreciated.

A summary of how the project will address aspects that may be of interest to AFN, is provided on the following page.



<u>Drinking Water</u> – A portion of the project site is located within Intake Protection Zone 2 (IPZ-2) of the Lindsay municipal drinking water system, as confirmed by Kawartha Conservation. However, the activities associated with the project are not anticipated to constitute a 'significant' drinking water threat, per the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks' 2017-2018 Table of Drinking Water Threats. Furthermore, the design of the proposed drainage infrastructure will be subject to approval through the CKL's Consolidated Linear Infrastructure Environmental Compliance Approval which prescribes stormwater quality treatment objectives in protection of downstream natural environments. During construction, caution will be exercised in the prevention of any fuel/oil spills; an emergency fuel/oil spill procedure will be established to mitigate the impacts of any spills, should they occur.

<u>Wildlife and Lands</u> – The project site is currently developed as a two-lane urban road cross-section having a shared left-turn centre lane. Resultingly, the project lands are not considered to contribute significantly to the natural environment. Based on the level of previous anthropogenic disturbance, and the project site's current use, the potential impact to fish, game, endangered species and lands, is believed to be relatively minimal. Kawartha Conservation has not identified a need for further natural environment studies to support the planned reconstruction.

Indigenous Heritage and Cultural Values — Stage I and II Archaeological Assessments were completed for the Angeline Street North corridor in 2021 and 2023, respectively. Ultimately, the Archaeological Assessments concluded that the project area be cleared of archaeological concerns. Digital versions of the Stage I and II Archaeological Assessment documents are provided to AFN via a temporary file-sharing link within the email accompanying this letter. As the project lands have been cleared of archaeological concerns, and the proposed use of the project lands is consistent with its current one, it is expected that the impact to Indigenous heritage and cultural values is limited. Should excavation unearth bones, remains or other such evidence of a native burial site or any other archaeological findings, AFN would be notified without delay.

In response to the notice for PIC #2, AFN identified a potential requirement to establish a special consultation process for this project as well as a \$300.00 File Fee. It's noted that these requirements were identified prior to AFN being provided with the information of the above summary. Overall, the impacts to typical areas of concern are believed to be relatively limited and appropriately mitigated; especially given the site's historical anthropogenic disturbance, current land use, and separation from the natural environment.

We request that AFN review the provided summary and PIC #2 presentation materials, and confirm if the File Fee and special consultation process are still believed to be appropriate/warranted.

I would like to acknowledge receipt of your correspondence, which was received May 1st, 2024, regarding the above noted project.

As you may be aware, the area in which this project is proposed is situated within the Traditional Territory of Alderville First Nation. Our First Nation's Territory is incorporated within the Williams Treaties Territory and was the subject of a claim under Canada's Specific Claims Policy, which has now been settled. All 7 First Nations within the Williams Treaties have had their harvesting rights legally reaffirmed and recognized through this settlement (2018).

In addition to Aboriginal title, Alderville First Nation rights in its Reserve and Traditional Territory and/or Treaty Territory include rights to hunt, fish and trap, to harvest plants for food and medicine, to protect and honour burial sites and other significant sites, to sustain and strengthen its spiritual and cultural connection to the land, to protect the Environment that supports its survival, to govern itself, sustain itself and prosper including deriving revenues from its lands and resources, and to participate in all governance and operational decisions about how the land and resources will be managed, used and protected.

Alderville First Nation is requiring a File Fee for this project in the amount of \$300.00. This Fee includes administration, an initial meeting, project updates as well as review of standard material and project overviews. Depending on the number of documents to be reviewed by the Consultation Department, additional fees may apply. **Please make this payment to Alderville First Nation and please indicate the project name or number on the cheque.** If you do not have a copy of Alderville First Nation's Consultation Protocol, it is available at: alderville.ca/wp-content/uploads/2017/02/AFNProtocol2.pdf.

Please note that the mapping in this document needs updating to reflect the Williams Treaties First Nations Settlement Agreement 2018.

In order to assist us in providing you with timely input, please provide us with a Notice of Request to Consult containing relevant information and material facts in sufficient form and detail to assist Alderville First Nation to understand the matter in order to prepare a meaningful response. Guidance for giving notice can be found on pages 11-12 of our Consultation Protocol. Based on the information that you have provided us with respect to the notice of the **Angeline Street North Reconstruction Municipal Class Environmental Assessment and Design, City of Kawartha Lakes,** Alderville First Nation may require a mutual agreement to establish a special consultation process for this project. After the information is reviewed it is expected that you or a representative will be in contact to discuss this matter in more detail and possibly set up a date and time to meet with Alderville First Nation in person or virtually.

Although we have not conducted exhaustive research nor do we have the resources to do so, there may be the presence of burial or archaeological sites in your proposed project area. Please note, that we have particular concern for the remains of our ancestors. Should excavation unearth bones, remains, or other such evidence of a native burial site or any other archaeological findings, we must be notified without delay. In the case of a burial site, Council reminds you of your obligations under the *Cemeteries Act* to notify the nearest First Nation Government or other community of Aboriginal people which is willing to act as a representative and whose members have a close cultural affinity to the interred person. As I am sure you are aware, the regulations further state that the representative is needed before the remains and associated artifacts can be removed. Should such a find occur, we request that you contact our First Nation immediately.

Furthermore, Alderville First Nation also has available, trained Archaeological Liaisons who can actively participate in the archaeological assessment process as a member of a field crew, the cost of which shall be borne by the proponent. Alderville First Nation expects engagement at Stage 1 of an archaeological assessment, so that we may include Indigenous Knowledge of the land in the process. We insist that at least one of our Archaeological Liaisons be involved in any Stage 2-4 assessments, including test pitting, and/or pedestrian surveys, to full excavation.

Although we may not always have representation at all stakeholders' and rights holders' meetings, it is our wish to be kept apprised throughout all phases of this project.

Angeline Street North Reconstruction, City of Kawartha Lakes

Dear Lois:

Thank you for your letter dated March 26th, 2025; the concerns outlined therein have been documented. Through the discussion provided by this response letter, we hope to address them to your satisfaction. To aid in the discussion, the Problem and Opportunity Statements for the Angeline Street North Reconstruction Municipal Class Environmental assessment are re-stated below:

Problem The City of Kawartha Lakes is projected to be home to an estimated **Statement:** 100,000 residents by 2031, which is an anticipated increase of 33% from 2011 population values.

> As a result of the projected growth, the 2012 Transportation Master Plan identified transportation capacity constraints on Kent Street West and Colborne Street West, with recommended improvements. Stand-alone corridor and EA studies for these intersections provided preferred intersection improvements which will be considered as part of this study for the Angeline Street North corridor.

Opportunity Statement:

The Angeline Street North corridor will be reviewed for potential vehicular traffic improvements to meet the project 2031 traffic demands. In addition, opportunities to incorporate access, improve safety, and enhance other modes of transport for existing and future residents will also be review.

The reconstruction also provides an opportunity to review the condition of and replace watermain, sanitary sewer, and storm sewer infrastructure where warranted.



The concerns identified by Curve Lake First Nation's (CLFN) letter are discussed individually below:

- Air Pollution An Air Quality Assessment was completed to investigate the potential impact of the Preliminary Preferred Alternative's (PPA) configuration on the air quality adjacent to a "Sensitive Receiver" at the northeast corner of the Kent Street West and Angeline Street North intersection (Ross Memorial Hospital property). The study included an assessment for a variety of contaminants including those identified in CLFN's letter. The Air Quality Assessment concluded that construction of the PPA improved the overall air quality impacts to the Sensitive Receiver in comparison to a "No Build" condition (i.e., maintaining existing conditions). The improved conditions were attributed to reduced congestion and idling periods.
- Noise Pollution As outlined by the Problem and Opportunity Statements, the traffic demands are projected to increase by 2031 and the MCEA intends to determine a PPA to accommodate them; i.e., the improvements of the PPA are not proposed in order to increase traffic demands. Therefore, the traffic noise is expected to increase with traffic demand, regardless of the proposed design alternatives. Generally speaking, the PPA is anticipated to provide for reduced congestion and idling periods, as noted above. Additionally, the local ecosystem along the corridor is not believed to be significant given the previous level of anthropogenic disturbance and current land use along the corridor.
- Tree Removal The degree of vegetation removal necessary to support reconstruction was a criterion considered in the evaluation of design alternatives, alongside other transportation, social, economic, natural, cultural and financial factors, to determine the PPA. Furthermore, it's a typical practice of the City of Kawartha Lakes to replace any removed tree with a new one, generally within the same location.
- More Impervious Surfaces The relationship identified between the increase in impervious surfaces and increase in stormwater runoff is correct. The proposed reconstruction of Angeline Street North will include the design and installation of drainage infrastructure to address stormwater management (SWM) requirements related to quantity (peak flows and volumes) and quality (sediment removal) objectives, ensuring that downstream conditions are not worsened by the proposed reconstruction. Ultimately, an Environmental Compliance Approval will be obtained to support the drainage infrastructure per the Ontario Water Resources Act and Environmental Protection Act.

• Spread of Invasive Species – The risk for invasive species is generally limited to the construction stage when the soil is disturbed, and the introduction of equipment to a project site. Given that the project site is centrally located within an urban center, the existing presence of invasive species is considered to be generally limited; however, through the preparation of contract documents, inclusion of specifications to limit the spread of invasives will be reviewed and included where appropriate. Provisions in this regard may include management of soil movement, and clean equipment standards for entering and working at the site.

We trust that the discussion provided above addresses the concerns identified by CLFN in their previous letter as it relates the Angeline Street North Reconstruction project's MCEA process.

Further to Lois' comments, please find below Curve Lake First Nation's comments regarding the Stage 1 and 2 Archaeological Assessments related to this project.

Curve Lake First Nation reviewed the Stage 1 and 2 Archaeological Assessments and concurred with the recommendations. Nevertheless, as a condition of all archaeological investigations in Ontario, should cultural material and/or ancestral remains be uncovered during construction activities, work in the vicinity cease immediately and Section 5.0 Advice on Compliance with Legislation of the Stage 2 archaeological assessment report should be consulted. Please note, that we have particular concern for the remains of our ancestors. Should excavation unearth bones, remains, or other such evidence of a native burial site or any other archaeological findings, we must be notified without delay.

In the case of a burial site, Council reminds you of your obligations under the *Cemeteries Act* to notify the nearest First Nation Government or other community of Aboriginal people which is willing to act as a representative and whose members have a close cultural affinity to the interred person. The regulations further state that the representative is needed before the remains and associated artifacts can be removed. Should such a find occur, we request that you contact our First Nation immediately.

We encourage the proponent and/or contractors of the proponent to remind their staff of these conditions prior to the commencement of construction and reiterate them during regular planning and/or health and safety meetings. We recommend this information be displayed in a prominent area such as the location of the Ontario Occupational Health & Safety Act and Regulations (i.e., The Green Book).

Furthermore, Curve Lake First Nation has adopted an Archaeological Protocol, which we expect to be followed within our Territory. We also have available, trained Cultural Heritage Liaisons and qualified staff who can actively participate in any future archaeological assessment process as a member of a field crew, the cost of which will be borne by the proponent. Curve Lake First Nation expects engagement at Stage 1 of an archaeological assessment so that we may include Indigenous Knowledge of the land in the process. We insist that our Cultural Heritage Liaisons be invited to participate in any Stage 2-4 assessments, including test pitting, and/or pedestrian surveys to full excavation.

I am writing to formally address the Angeline St. N. Reconstruction Project, which was presented to Curve Lake First Nation by the Ainley Group. We have reviewed the Public Information Centre materials, Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment, and Stage 2 Property Survey reports associated with the project.

We would like to emphasize that the area proposed for disturbance lies within the Traditional and Treaty territories of Curve Lake First Nation, as well as the territories of the seven signatory Nations of the Williams Treaties. As stewards of these lands, a responsibility passed down through generations, it is our duty to ensure their protection.

Given the current stage of the project, we would like to emphasize the following concerns regarding the cumulative impacts it may bring:

- Air Pollution: more traffic results in higher emissions of pollutants such as carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, and particulate matter. This will worsen air quality.
- Noise Pollution: Traffic noise will increase. This can disrupt local ecosystems, particularly for animals that rely on quieter environments.
- Tree removal: Expanding the road will require tree removal and loss of some (small) urbanized green areas.
- More Impervious Surfaces: the increase of impervious surfaces will increase the stormwater runoff and thus overload drainage systems but also increase the amount of pollutants entering these systems.
- Spread of Invasive Plants: Road construction and expansion can introduce invasive plant species, which may spread into surrounding areas.

All of these impacts mentioned are particularly concerning given that Lindsay's population is expected to increase by 33% by 2031 compared to 2011. It's important to assess and mitigate all the potential cumulative impacts associated with this population growth.

As identified through previous correspondence and notices, Ainley Group the City of Kawartha Lakes (CKL) are completing a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) process in support of reconstruction of Angeline Street North in Lindsay, ON.

The project proposes the reconstruction of Angeline Street North, generally from Roosevelt Street to Colborne Street West, to accommodate projected traffic volumes along the corridor. The project is being completed as a Schedule 'B' activity through the MCEA process. Public Information Centre (PIC) #2 for the project was conducted on May 9, 2024, which presented a Preliminary Preferred Alternative for the roadway's reconstruction. The presentation materials from PIC #2 provide a comprehensive summary of the project and progress to date with respect to the MCEA process. Curve Lake First Nations' (CLFN) review of the presentation materials is requested to establish a foundational understanding of the project and better facilitate consultation efforts. The PIC #2 presentation materials are enclosed and also publicly available through the following web address:

https://www.kawarthalakes.ca/en/municipal-services/major-projects.aspx

Additionally, a summary indicating how the project will address specific areas of concern to CLFN within their Traditional and Treaty Territory, is provided below and as requested in their letter dated March 20, 2019.

<u>Possible Environmental Impact to Drinking Water</u> – A portion of the project site is located within Intake Protection Zone 2 (IPZ-2) of the Lindsay municipal drinking water system, as confirmed by Kawartha Conservation. However, the activities associated with the project are not anticipated to constitute a 'significant' drinking water threat, per the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks' 2017-2018 Table of Drinking Water Threats. Furthermore, the design of the proposed

drainage infrastructure will be subject to approval through the CKL's *Consolidated Linear Infrastructure Environmental Compliance Approval* which prescribes stormwater quality treatment objectives in protection of downstream natural environments. During construction, caution will be exercised in the prevention of any fuel/oil spills; an emergency fuel/oil spill procedure will be established to mitigate the impacts of any spills, should they occur.

Endangerment to Fish and Wild Games/Impact on Endangered Species, Lands, Savannas, etc. – The project site is currently developed with a two-lane urban road cross-section having a shared left-turn centre lane. The project lands are not considered to contribute significantly to the natural environment. Based on the level of previous anthropogenic disturbance, and the project site's current use, the potential impact to fish and wild games, and endangered species, lands and savannas, is believed to be relatively minimal. Kawartha Conservation has not identified a need for further natural environment studies to support the planned reconstruction.

Impact on Aboriginal Heritage and Cultural Values – As noted in previous correspondence, Stage I and II Archaeological Assessments were completed along the Angeline Street North corridor. Ultimately, the Archaeological Assessments concluded that the project area be cleared of archaeological concerns. Digital versions of the Stage I and II Archaeological Assessment documents were previously provided to CLFN via a temporary file sharing link. As the project lands have been cleared of archaeological concerns, and the proposed use of the project lands is consistent with its current one, it is expected that the impact on Aboriginal Heritage and Cultural Values is limited.

In response to a previous notice for PIC #1, CLFN identified a requirement to complete consultation efforts through the Special Consultation Framework (SCF) specified by their Consultation and Accommodation Standards, which has been reviewed by Ainley Group and City of Kawartha Lakes staff, as well as a \$250.00 File Fee.

It's noted that the requirements to complete the SCF were identified over five years ago, and prior to the CFLN being provided with the information of the above summary. Overall, the impacts to the identified areas of concern are believed to be relatively limited and appropriately mitigated; especially given the site's historical anthropogenic disturbance, current land use, and separation from the natural environment.

We request that CLFN review the summary and PIC #2 presentation materials (link above) provided herein, and confirm if the SCF is still believed to be appropriate/warranted, given the project's relation to the identified areas of concern.

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In response to your first comment regarding your concern for a potential increase in accidents at the intersection of Roosevelt Street and Broad Street, it is the City of Kawartha Lakes and Ainley Group's objective to provide a reconstruction design that adheres to all safety regulations and provides a safe environment for all motorists and pedestrians.

To address your second comment regarding your concern for the potential impacts to the visibility from your driveway through the removal of your garden wall: as the Preferred Alternative and final reconstruction design have yet to be determined, we cannot say with certainty whether removal of the garden wall will be required; however, we will continue to seek your input during the EA and design processes to ensure that your concerns are being addressed as much as is feasible.

To address your third comment that the proposed plan is based on future traffic volumes and that the current traffic levels do not support immediate change: the Transportation Master Plan (TMP), previously completed in 2012, identified sections of Angeline Street North that would not adequately accommodate the anticipated 2031 traffic demands. Although the TMP considers future traffic volumes, it is important to continuously update and improve the roadway network to plan for them prior to its capacity being exceeded. 



As identified through previous correspondence and notices, Ainley Group the City of Kawartha Lakes (CKL) are completing a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) process in support of reconstruction of Angeline Street North in Lindsay, ON.

The project proposes the reconstruction of Angeline Street North, generally from Roosevelt Street to Colborne Street West, to accommodate projected traffic volumes along the corridor. The project is being completed as a Schedule 'B' activity through the MCEA process. Public Information Centre (PIC) #2 for the project was conducted on May 9, 2024, which presented a Preliminary Preferred Alternative for the roadway's reconstruction. The presentation materials from PIC #2 provide a comprehensive summary of the project and progress to date with respect to the MCEA process. Curve Lake First Nations' (CLFN) review of the presentation materials is requested to establish a foundational understanding of the project and better facilitate consultation efforts. The PIC #2 presentation materials are enclosed and also publicly available through the following web address:

https://www.kawarthalakes.ca/en/municipal-services/major-projects.aspx

Additionally, a summary indicating how the project will address specific areas of concern to CLFN within their Traditional and Treaty Territory, is provided below and as requested in their letter dated March 20, 2019.

<u>Possible Environmental Impact to Drinking Water</u> – A portion of the project site is located within Intake Protection Zone 2 (IPZ-2) of the Lindsay municipal drinking water system, as confirmed by Kawartha Conservation. However, the activities associated with the project are not anticipated to constitute a 'significant' drinking water threat, per the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks' 2017-2018 Table of Drinking Water Threats. Furthermore, the design of the proposed

drainage infrastructure will be subject to approval through the CKL's *Consolidated Linear Infrastructure Environmental Compliance Approval* which prescribes stormwater quality treatment objectives in protection of downstream natural environments. During construction, caution will be exercised in the prevention of any fuel/oil spills; an emergency fuel/oil spill procedure will be established to mitigate the impacts of any spills, should they occur.

Endangerment to Fish and Wild Games/Impact on Endangered Species, Lands, Savannas, etc. – The project site is currently developed with a two-lane urban road cross-section having a shared left-turn centre lane. The project lands are not considered to contribute significantly to the natural environment. Based on the level of previous anthropogenic disturbance, and the project site's current use, the potential impact to fish and wild games, and endangered species, lands and savannas, is believed to be relatively minimal. Kawartha Conservation has not identified a need for further natural environment studies to support the planned reconstruction.

Impact on Aboriginal Heritage and Cultural Values – As noted in previous correspondence, Stage I and II Archaeological Assessments were completed along the Angeline Street North corridor. Ultimately, the Archaeological Assessments concluded that the project area be cleared of archaeological concerns. Digital versions of the Stage I and II Archaeological Assessment documents were previously provided to CLFN via a temporary file sharing link. As the project lands have been cleared of archaeological concerns, and the proposed use of the project lands is consistent with its current one, it is expected that the impact on Aboriginal Heritage and Cultural Values is limited.

In response to a previous notice for PIC #1, CLFN identified a requirement to complete consultation efforts through the Special Consultation Framework (SCF) specified by their Consultation and Accommodation Standards, which has been reviewed by Ainley Group and City of Kawartha Lakes staff, as well as a \$250.00 File Fee.

It's noted that the requirements to complete the SCF were identified over five years ago, and prior to the CFLN being provided with the information of the above summary. Overall, the impacts to the identified areas of concern are believed to be relatively limited and appropriately mitigated; especially given the site's historical anthropogenic disturbance, current land use, and separation from the natural environment.

We request that CLFN review the summary and PIC #2 presentation materials (link above) provided herein, and confirm if the SCF is still believed to be appropriate/warranted, given the project's relation to the identified areas of concern.

Your concern for the potential vibrational and structural impacts to the existing underground parking structure, as a result of the construction and the widened roadway, are noted and valid. As appropriate, the City of Kawartha Lakes (City) plans to complete ancillary site-specific vibrational and structural investigation efforts to address these concerns.

The initial stages of these investigations include efforts to establish a foundational understanding of the structure's existing/baseline conditions, and identify the potential impacts to it as a result of the roadway's construction and operation. The initial stages will identify if significant potential impacts are foreseen and, if warranted, further assessments to address them.

The field activities of the initial stages of the structural investigation (and topographic survey) were completed on September 19, 2024, and we appreciate your cooperation in completing it. A site visit for the vibrational investigation would be required to install monitoring devices on the inside and outside of the building; advance notice will be provided to coordinate this visit.

Concern for large vehicles was noted specifically within your comments. The existing and reconstructed roadway are expected/planned to accomodate large vehicle users (e.g., tractor-trailers and school buses). Please be aware, however, that the vibrational



and structural investigation efforts would consider the 'worst-case' loading associated with large vehicles, as appropriate.

Site Design Comments

The comments provided regarding the site's features and operations are greatly appreciated as it deepens our understanding of existing site features and operations that may be affected by the Preliminary Preferred Alternative.

Ultimately, City and Ainley Group staff are interested in exploring opportunities for the mitigation of these impacts. We believe these considerations, and any associated discussions, would be more productive if they were completed after the structural and vibrational investigations for the structure, and the detailed design of the reconstructed roadway, have been progressed. In doing so, the nature and severity of the impacts to the site, and the feasibility of potential mitigative solutions, can be better understood.

To begin progressing to that stage, a topographical survey of the site and underground parking structure was also completed during the previous site visit, to record features and elevations.

We trust that we have addressed your concerns at this time and thank you for your continued interest in the Angeline Street North Reconstruction EA.

Thank you for your letter dated March 26th, 2025; the concerns outlined therein have been documented. Through the discussion provided by this response letter, we hope to address them to your satisfaction. To aid in the discussion, the Problem and Opportunity Statements for the Angeline Street North Reconstruction Municipal Class Environmental assessment are re-stated below:

Problem The City of Kawartha Lakes is projected to be home to an estimated Statement: 100,000 residents by 2031, which is an anticipated increase of 33% from 2011 population values.

> As a result of the projected growth, the 2012 Transportation Master Plan identified transportation capacity constraints on Kent Street West and Colborne Street West, with recommended improvements. Stand-alone corridor and EA studies for these intersections provided preferred intersection improvements which will be considered as part of this study for the Angeline Street North corridor.

Opportunity Statement:

The Angeline Street North corridor will be reviewed for potential vehicular traffic improvements to meet the project 2031 traffic demands. In addition, opportunities to incorporate access, improve safety, and enhance other modes of transport for existing and future residents will also be review.

The reconstruction also provides an opportunity to review the condition of and replace watermain, sanitary sewer, and storm sewer infrastructure where warranted.



The concerns identified by Curve Lake First Nation's (CLFN) letter are discussed individually below:

- Air Pollution An Air Quality Assessment was completed to investigate the potential impact of the Preliminary Preferred Alternative's (PPA) configuration on the air quality adjacent to a "Sensitive Receiver" at the northeast corner of the Kent Street West and Angeline Street North intersection (Ross Memorial Hospital property). The study included an assessment for a variety of contaminants including those identified in CLFN's letter. The Air Quality Assessment concluded that construction of the PPA improved the overall air quality impacts to the Sensitive Receiver in comparison to a "No Build" condition (i.e., maintaining existing conditions). The improved conditions were attributed to reduced congestion and idling periods.
- Noise Pollution As outlined by the Problem and Opportunity Statements, the traffic demands are projected to increase by 2031 and the MCEA intends to determine a PPA to accommodate them; i.e., the improvements of the PPA are not proposed in order to increase traffic demands. Therefore, the traffic noise is expected to increase with traffic demand, regardless of the proposed design alternatives. Generally speaking, the PPA is anticipated to provide for reduced congestion and idling periods, as noted above. Additionally, the local ecosystem along the corridor is not believed to be significant given the previous level of anthropogenic disturbance and current land use along the corridor.
- Tree Removal The degree of vegetation removal necessary to support reconstruction was a criterion considered in the evaluation of design alternatives, alongside other transportation, social, economic, natural, cultural and financial factors, to determine the PPA. Furthermore, it's a typical practice of the City of Kawartha Lakes to replace any removed tree with a new one, generally within the same location.
- More Impervious Surfaces The relationship identified between the increase in impervious surfaces and increase in stormwater runoff is correct. The proposed reconstruction of Angeline Street North will include the design and installation of drainage infrastructure to address stormwater management (SWM) requirements related to quantity (peak flows and volumes) and quality (sediment removal) objectives, ensuring that downstream conditions are not worsened by the proposed reconstruction. Ultimately, an Environmental Compliance Approval will be obtained to support the drainage infrastructure per the Ontario Water Resources Act and Environmental Protection Act.

Spread of Invasive Species – The risk for invasive species is generally limited to
the construction stage when the soil is disturbed, and the introduction of equipment
to a project site. Given that the project site is centrally located within an urban
center, the existing presence of invasive species is considered to be generally
limited; however, through the preparation of contract documents, inclusion of
specifications to limit the spread of invasives will be reviewed and included where
appropriate. Provisions in this regard may include management of soil movement,
and clean equipment standards for entering and working at the site.

We trust that the discussion provided above addresses the concerns identified by CLFN in their previous letter as it relates the Angeline Street North Reconstruction project's MCEA process.

Vegetation Removal

The degree of vegetation removal was considered as one of the criteria by which the Preliminary Preferred Alternative was evaluated. The impact to the natural environment was balanced wholistically alongside the benefits/impacts to other environments (e.g., technical, social/cultural, economic/financial).

The exact extent of vegetation removal within your property is not fully known at this preliminary stage. Based on the projected footprint of the Preliminary Preferred Alternative, and as presented at PIC #2, a portion of the existing hedge and the bush located next to it would appear to be impacted; no existing trees within the property appear to be impacted at this stage. A more comprehensive understanding of the impacts to on-site vegetation is anticipated during detailed design when the alignment and boulevard grading of the reconstructed roadway have been progressed.

The addition of vegetation within the right-of-way would increase its width requirements (i.e., increase the land required) in order to retain municipal ownership of them and facilitate their maintenance. The mitigation of site-specific impacts within your property can be discussed with City of Kawartha Lakes (City) and/or Ainley Group staff during a future site visit.

Driveway Functionality

The exact length of driveway to be removed, and the resulting grade of the remainder, is not fully known at this preliminary stage. The design of the Preliminary Preferred Alternative intends to achieve the driveway grading requirements of the City's



Infrastructure Guidelines: "a minimum 2.0% grade... up to a maximum of 8.0% on low volume local roads". A maximum grade of 6.0% would most likely be pursued for design purposes based on the traffic volume of Angeline Street South.

A more comprehensive understanding of the impacts to the driveway is anticipated during detailed design when the alignment and boulevard grading of the reconstructed roadway have been progressed. Additional topographical data has recently been obtained along the corridor to support detailed design efforts.

Gas Service

As is typical of road reconstruction projects, the City and Ainley Group will coordinate with all utility providers, including Enbridge, to identify and complete any required service relocations.

Road and Roadside Safety

The design of the reconstructed roadway will be completed in accordance with the Transportation Association of Canada's *Geometric Design Guide for Canadian Roads*, which provides design guidance in consideration of both on-road and roadside safety in general relation to speed limits. The posted speed limit along the Angeline Street corridor is not proposed to be increased through the Preliminary Preferred Alternative.

The purpose of the Preliminary Preferred Alternative's additional lanes is to improve the operating capacity of the Angeline Street corridor to better accommodate projected future traffic volumes (which are projected to occur regardless of any proposed reconstruction). By increasing its operating capacity, an improved efficiency for traffic movement through the corridor, and a reduction in congestion, is anticipated. Generally speaking, the "stop-and-go" nature of traffic congestion often leads to an increase in aggressive driving maneuvers. The proposed additional lanes would permit passing to the benefit of improved traffic flow, but not in excess of the posted speed limit, as traffic can navigate around vehicles travelling at excessively low speeds or turning into entrances.

As Preliminary Preferred Alternative proposes to maintain existing speed limits, help to mitigate traffic congestion, and implement the guidance of the preeminent source for road design guide, it is not associated with any significant impact to on-road and roadside safety.

On-Site Meeting

City and/or Ainley Group staff agree that an on-site meeting may be beneficial to discuss site-specific concerns and details. As noted above, the exact extents of some design aspects are not yet known; a more comprehensive understanding of the impacts is anticipated during detailed design. To ensure our discussions are productive, we propose scheduling this meeting for when we have progressed into the detailed design stage.

We are pleased to confirm that the provided comments will still be formally recorded in the PIC's documentation. Please accept the following in response to your submitted comment(s).

It's our understanding that GWD Planners represents 2607226 Ontario Inc. (Sunray Group) with respect to their proposed development of the approximately 1.6 ha vacant property generally located across from the Town & Country Centre and Lindsay Professional Building. Based on the provided Site Plan (revised October 17, 2022), Two (2) entrances are proposed as part of the development to provide access/egress from subject property, generally in the following locations:

- South entrance approximately 50 m to the north of Chadwin Drive
- North entrance approximately 120 m to the south of Colborne Street West and opposite the existing entrance to the Lindsay Professional Building.

The MCEA process will consider the proposed commercial development, including its proposed access locations, in all future phases of the study. It should be noted that the design of the proposed entrances is beyond the current scope of the project and remains the responsibility of the developer.

We can also confirm that none of the alternatives evaluated by the MCEA considered road widening (i.e., property acquisition) of the Angeline Street North right-of-way along the frontage of the subject property.



The findings of the Stage I Archaeological Assessment warranted the undertaking of a Stage II Archaeological Assessment which conducted a test pit survey in order to determine the presence or absence of archaeological materials within the project limits. Ultimately, the Stage II Archaeological Assessment concluded that the project area be cleared of archaeological concerns. Both the Stage I and II Archaeological Assessment documents are provided via a temporary file sharing link provided in the email accompanying this letter.

The concrete median of the north leg of the Angeline Street North and Kent Street West intersection, is planned to extend beyond the entrance location of the Dentistry on Kent property. In doing so, unsafe lefthand-turn movements into and out of the property are expected to be prevented.

The potential difficulties for patients turning right onto Angeline Street North from this entrance location and wishing to then turn left onto Kent Street West, can be appreciated. Unfortunately, given the entrance's proximity to the intersection, the feasibility of improving this movement through the roadway's design is considerably restricted; however, efforts will be taken to better facilitate it where possible.

For patients exiting via this entrance and wishing to travel the eastbound lanes of Kent Street West, the nearby Roosevelt Street is believed to provide some benefit. Roosevelt Street, located less than 150 m from the subject intersection, provides access to Adelaide Street which has a signalized intersection with Kent Street West

We acknowledge that the project site is located partially within the Intake Protection Zone 2 (IPZ-2) for the Lindsay municipal drinking water system. Consideration will be made in the design and planning of proposed works and their construction, as appropriate. At this time, the proposed works are not anticipated as constituting a Significant Drinking Water Threat (per the 2017-2018 Table).

An Erosion and Sediment Control Plan will be prepared as part of the detailed design stage to prevent sediment/turbid materials from entering the drainage waters within the IPZ-2 during construction. The proposed drainage infrastructure will be designed for acceptance through the City's Consolidated Linear Infrastructure Environmental Compliance Approval. As a result, the proposed works are expected to also achieve prescribed stormwater quality requirements, including sediment removal, prior to discharging to the drainage waters within the IPZ-2 after their construction (i.e., during normal operating conditions).

Caution is expected to be exercised by the Contractor during construction. Additionally, the typical Special Provisions of the City's tender contract documents include requirements for the reporting of the spills or discharges of pollutants or contaminants to the Contract Administrator.



Comments were provided with respect to two properties located at the Angeline Street North and Colborne Street West intersection:

- Southeast Quadrant: Colborne Lodge (133 Colborne Street West); and,
- Northeast Quadrant: Fairview Baptist Church (130 Colborne Street West)

Firstly, we are pleased to inform you that representatives for each of the respective properties have been circulated on notices for the ongoing EA process; the most recent instance being the notice for PIC #2.

The comments you've provided generally pertain to the entrances along Angeline Street North for each of the above-noted properties. The concrete medians of the north and south legs of the Colborne Street West and Angeline Street North intersection are planned to extend beyond these entrance locations. In doing so, unsafe lefthand-turn movements into and out of the properties are expected to be prevented.

At this time, it can be confirmed that the existing entrance location for Colborne Lodge is planned to be maintained under proposed conditions as it provides the only access/egress for the main parking lot.

It's currently unknown if the subject entrance of the Fairview Baptist Church property will be maintained under proposed conditions. Although there is a preference for its continued use, if the entrance's proximity to the Colborne Street West and Angeline Street North intersection poses safety concerns to its users, it may warrant closure/removal. Access/egress for the parking area would still be provided via the other



existing entrance that is proposed to be maintained along Colborne Street West. If closure of the Fairview Baptist Church's Angeline Street North entrance is warranted, direct consultation with the affected parties would be completed to mitigate the impacts to the site's operations as much as feasible.

Would you have any additional information available for the existing ventilation structures? We are trying to understand their current use to assess how our design alternatives would impact them. If their openings to the surface were to be relocated easterly, broadly speaking, what would be the impacts to their operation/ implications to their configuration?

Additionally, the drawings appear to show some modifications within the parking area to bring the curb line westerly towards the ventilation structures. The most recent Streetview (June 2021) does not reflect the proposed conditions. Has the construction since been completed? If not, does RMH still intend to complete the modifications?

Ainley Group is working with the City of Kawartha Lakes to advance the ongoing Environmental Assessment process for the widening of Angeline Street in Lindsay. You may recall last corresponding with our office in January 2019 through Elizabeth Bonucchi.

The process has been delayed due to COVID, among other factors, and the City of Kawartha Lakes, with the support of Ainley Group, plans to resume it this fall. Since 2019, there have been staffing changes within Ainley Group, and I have since assumed Elizabeth's previous role on this project. I look forward to working with RMH staff through the public consultation and design processes. At this time, I'm hoping to gather more information about the underground infrastructure located along the east property line immediately to the north of Kent Street intersection.

From the records I have available to me, it appears that you and Veronica Nelson had a call with Elizabeth on January 27, 2019 and discussed this matter. From what I infer, the underground infrastructure at the time consisted of diesel storage tank and ventilation structures. The diesel storage tank had been "red tagged" in November 2018, and RMH was in the midst of deciding how to address the matter with any necessary construction anticipated in Spring or Summer 2019.

Could RMH please provide any details (including drawings) related to what the chosen course of action ultimately was and whether it has been completed?

I recognize that a significant amount of time has passed since Ainley Group's last discussion with RMH staff, so if you're not the appropriate contact, could you please direct me to someone that could assist me?

Background and Purpose of Meeting

In November 2022, a discretionary meeting was conducted with stakeholders located adjacent to the Angeline Street North and Kent Street West intersection. At that meeting, RMH staff (all of which have since been succeeded by those present at the current meeting) identified the hospital's on-site ventilation structures as being atgrade air intakes to the building. Amongst other comments, the quality of air received by the intake structures was identified as a primary concern of RMH staff.

In 2024, the CKL directed AG to engage NAPSCI to complete an air quality assessment for the identified structures. In NAPSCI contacted RMH staff seeking confirmation of the structures' purposes and operation. In response, RMH staff noted that they had other concerns with the project to share in addition to the air quality aspects. It was decided that a meeting between the attending parties would be beneficial to receive these comments in addition to the primary intent of confirming the ventilation structures' purpose/operation.

1 Overview of Current Study and the Environmental Assessment Process

NAPSCI staff provided a brief summary of the intent of the air quality assessment, and identified the need for RMH staff to definitively identify the purpose of the ventilation structures so as to help them better direct the scope of their efforts.

AG staff provided a brief overview of the Environmental Assessment process, in general, and the history of the current project. AG staff will provide a webpage link to RMH staff where they can find further details about the project.

Action By: Ainley Group

2 Ventilation Structures

RMH staff provided a general description of the ventilation structures' function:

- Believed to be "fresh air intakes" for the Hospital's boiler room, and that the boiler room is designed to rely on positive air pressure.
- The connection between the ventilation structures and boiler room is passive; i.e., there is no fan driving air flow between the two locations. As a result, air flow could be observed in either direction, depending on atmospheric conditions.
- Historically, staff have been warned to prevent diesel engines from running for prolonged periods near the fresh air intake structures to limit the risk for their exhaust fumes into the structure.

RMH staff committed to confirming, with certainty, the purpose of the ventilation structures via forthcoming correspondence.

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[Post-Meeting Note: a photograph of a mechanical schematic drawing has been provided since the meeting; a written description of the ventilation structures' purposes was requested by AG staff in response.]

Action By: Ross Memorial Hospital

3 Stakeholder Concern – Air Quality

RMH staff noted that, while the quality of air at the ventilation structure should be considered, it is not their primary concern with the reconstruction of Angeline Street North (see Item No. 5).

RMH staff acknowledged that the air quality during road reconstruction represents short-term conditions and, resultingly, their concern is minimal. Care should be taken during construction to limit the runtimes of equipment in close proximity to the structures.

RMH staff speculated that the improved traffic efficiency along Angeline Street North, associated with the operation of the Preliminary Preferred Alternative, may improve/offset the impacts to air quality at the ventilation structures.

AG staff reiterated that the currently planned course of action is to proceed with the air quality assessment through NAPSCI; but will confirm with CKL whether the forthcoming confirmation of the ventilation structures' purpose has the potential to influence its scope.

Action By: Ainley Group and City of Kawartha Lakes

4 Review of Existing RMH Site Access/Egress

RMH staff answered questions about the site, and relayed observations about current access/egress features/trends. This information has been summarized in the attached figure.

5 Stakeholder Concern – Site Access/Egress

RMH staff highlighted that the only public access to the Emergency Room and only ambulance access to the ambulance bay, are along Angeline Street North. Maintaining these accesses during construction is of paramount concern to RMH staff. AG staff noted that they, along with the CKL, planned to consult with RMH staff during the future detailed design stage to establish an access plant to the latter's satisfaction; RMH staff agreed to further discuss and work to address the concern at that future project stage.

RMH staff noted that lefthand-turn maneuvers, from the parking lot entrance onto Angeline Street North, were difficult at times due to significant vehicle queuing in the

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southbound lanes of the north leg of the Kent Street West/Angeline Street North intersection. Additionally, a notable increase in the volume of pedestrian users, especially crossing Angeline Street North, has been observed near the same parking lot entrance; RMH staff attribute this to the recent completion of the Community Care center located there (it should also be noted that the Community Care center's entrance is located opposite of the RMH entrance). RMH staff had wondered if the degree of traffic at this parking lot entrance warranted the installation of traffic signals in the future. AG staff noted that the Preliminary Preferred Alternative was expected to improve vehicle queueing efficiency of the subject lanes, which should alleviate the observed issues to some degree. Additionally, the influence of the traffic signals on the north leg of the subject intersection may lead to less desirable traffic efficiency overall. [Post-Meeting Note: AG staff will discuss RMH comments regarding traffic signalization with the CKL, as it is currently outside of the project scope.]

RMH staff have concerns for the increased complexity of left-hand turns from the subject entrance onto Angeline Street North; vehicles that are egressing from the RMH parking lot entrance would need to cross two northbound lanes under proposed conditions, as opposed to the one lane under existing conditions. AG staff recorded the comment and noted that the Preliminary Preferred Alternative is intended to improve the efficiency of traffic flow through the corridor for future projected traffic volumes.
