

Canada Day Fireworks Safety Thinking about setting off fireworks?

You may need a permit! Under our Fireworks By-Law, a permit is always required for public fireworks displays and fireworks in parks.

You also need a permit to use fireworks on your own property — unless it's on these approved dates:

- Family Day (February 16-18)
- Victoria Day (May 18-20)
- Indigenous Peoples Day (June 20-22)
- Canada Day (June 30-July 2)
- Labour Day (August 30-September 2)
- New Year's Eve (December 30-January 1)

On these days, fireworks are only allowed between dusk and 11pm. Fireworks require 30 metres in all directions from buildings, trees and property lines to be safely discharged.

Want to light fireworks outside of those dates? You'll need a permit, found on our website under the Fire Services section.

Acceptable items

- Household hazardous waste: batteries, paints and solvents, pesticides, fertilizers
- Bulky plastics: Clean, broken, and empty garbage cans, lawn furniture, plastic drums, milk crates
- Electronics: computers, small appliances, game systems and more
- Textiles: clothing, footwear, linen.

Tax reminders

Registered Charity Rebate and Tax Reductions due to demolition, fire or change of use of property: Application deadline is February 28, 2026 for the 2025 tax year.

Low-Income Seniors and Disabled Persons Property Owner Rebates

Property Tax Assistance Program: depending on your income, you may be eligible for a rebate of up to \$300 rebate. Application deadline is June 30, 2025. www.kawarthalakes.ca/taxes

Utility Billing Water Relief Program

Depending on your income, you may be eligible for a credit of 20% of water billed in the previous year. Application deadline is September 30, 2025. www.kawarthalakes.ca/utilitybilling
