REPORTING A CONCERN TO HOUSING

Tenant & Maintenance concerns are very important to Housing. To ensure that your concern is addressed as quickly as possible, we have dedicated staff that receive concerns and input into the computer system to ensure that all concerns are documented and acted upon.

There are now two ways to put a concern into KLH Housing Corp.

1. By phone: 705.324.9870 and press 2
2. By going on the KLH Housing Webpage and “entering a concern”
(Tenant Concern or Maintenance Concern) www.klhhousingcorp.ca

We need the assistance of tenants to bring forward the concerns they are seeing to be able to take the appropriate action. Please include date, time and what happened in your concern. If you have a photo, it can also be attached through the housing website. This will allow us to address your concern as quickly as possible. **We ask that concerns are not emailed or called directly to KLH Housing staff because they may be out of the office for extended periods of time for vacation, sickness or meetings.**

WINTER SNOW CLEARING

Snow removal work may be preformed 7 days a week. Snow removal efforts begin in the morning at approximately 7:00am and continue until all parking lots and sidewalks have been plowed. Ice melt is applied by maintenance staff to all parking lots and sidewalks as required. All common areas will be cleared. Individual parking spots will not be cleared. It may be necessary to remove all vehicles from a parking area to complete snow removal. KLH Housing Corp. will issue a 24 hour notice requesting you remove your vehicle from the parking lot for snow clearing to be completed. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

PARKING

All parking spots are assigned by KLH Housing Corp. Only visitors may park short term in the designated visitor parking spaces. Also there is no parking for any reason where it is clearly marked 'Fire Route'. Tenant vehicles can only be parked in the assigned spot. All vehicles parking illegally may be towed at the owner's expense.

WINTER HOUSEHOLD MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST

Check and clean or replace furnace air filters, remove dust and dirt from fans, radiators and heat registers, Vacuum bathroom fan grille, Vacuum radiator grilles on back of refrigerators and freezers, and empty and clean drip trays, Monitor your home for excessive moisture levels, If you have a plumbing fixture that is not used frequently, such as a laundry tub or spare bathroom sink, run some water briefly to keep water in the trap, Clean drains in sinks and bathtubs, Check electrical cords and plugs; if worn, or if plugs or cords feel warm to the touch, replace immediately.

TURKEY RECIPE CHEAT-SHEET

How big of a turkey? This method is best for a 12 to 16 pound bird. (Buy 1 to 1 1/2 pounds turkey for each guest.)

How long to cook the turkey? 13 minutes of cooking time for each pound of turkey if roasting empty and 15 minutes per pound if stuffed.

What temperature to cook the turkey? Preheat the oven to 450°F then drop the temperature to 350°F after putting the turkey into the oven.

What temperature should the turkey be? The turkey is done when it registers a minimum of 165° in the thickest part of the thigh.

BUTTERSCOTCH CONFETTI RECIPE

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup peanut butter smooth
- 1/4 cup butter
- 1 package (10 oz) butterscotch chips
- 1 bag (10 oz size) miniature marshmallows coloured/flavoured variety

Instructions

Put marshmallows in large bowl
 Melt peanut butter and butter in saucepan on LOW heat, just until melted! Do not overheat.
 Remove from heat. Make sure mixture is not too hot before adding butterscotch chips or it will crystallize.
 Stir in butterscotch chips, continue to stir until all is melted.
 Fold mixture into bowl of marshmallows. Combine well.
 Press into 8x8 greased baking pan.
 Refrigerate until firm. Cut into 16 large squares

Notes:

One big tip I have when making Butterscotch Confetti Squares is to make sure the butter/peanut butter mix isn't too hot prior to adding the butterscotch chips.
