APPLICATION FOR LOTTERY LICENCE ELIGIBILITY

The purpose of the enclosed form is to provide the necessary information required to determine the eligibility of organisations wishing to conduct a gaming event within the jurisdiction of the City of Kawartha Lakes.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for lottery licensing, an applicant must have an established organisational structure. The applicant must be a legal entity and must have a formal document that establishes the organisation. However, incorporation, whether provincial or federal, is neither a prerequisite nor a guarantee that a licence will be issued. No one may use lottery proceeds to start up an organisation.

In order to be eligible, an organisation must:

- have been in existence for at least one year;
- have provided charitable community services consistent with the primary objects and purposes of the organisation for at least one year;
- have a place of business in Ontario;
- demonstrate that it is established to provide charitable services in Ontario;
- propose to use proceeds for charitable purposes or objects that benefit Ontario and its residents; and
- Assume full responsibility for the conduct and management of its lottery events.

The terms and conditions for each lottery licence set specific application requirements, which are summarized in the relevant licensing policy sections of the Alcohol & Gaming Commission of Ontario's *Lottery Licensing Policy Manual*.

When an organisation first applies for any type of lottery licence, or whenever an eligibility review is required, it must provide all of the following information and documents that apply to it:

- a copy of its letters patent;
- a copy of its constitution and by-laws;
- a copy of its budget for the current year;
- a copy of its financial statements for the preceding year;
- a list of its Board of Directors;
- its latest report to the Public Guardian and Trustee;
- its charitable number for income tax purposes;

- a copy of its Notification of Charitable Registration letter from the Canada Revenue Agency with any supporting documentation indicating the applicant's status and terms of registration;
- copies of its charitable returns to the Canada Revenue Agency for the previous calendar year;
- a detailed descriptions of its activities; and
- a copy of its annual report.

The organisation must also provide any other information that will assist the licensing officer to determine the charitable nature of its purposes, objects and activities.

After the review has been completed, the licensing officer may require additional information to process the application. The organisation must provide any information that is requested.

If any changes are made to the documents submitted, the organisation must provide the licensing officer with the amended documents as soon as they are available.

Because organisations change, an organisation that is considered eligible for lottery licensing must continue to provide the licensing officer with any amended documents as soon as they are available.

Organisations that receive lottery licences will be subject to periodic eligibility reviews.

INFORMATION ON WHAT GOVERNING DOCUMENTS ARE AND WHAT THEY SHOULD CONTAIN

Constituting Documents

Every applicant organisation must have a document that establishes the organisation, setting out the members' common purpose and detailing how the organisation will operate in order to achieve that purpose. Formal documents include Letters Patent, constitution, and memorandum of association. Informal associations that have not adopted formal written constituting documents are not eligible for lottery licensing.

The organisation must demonstrate that the following items are included in its constituting documents:

- The organisation's name;
- The organisation's purpose or object;

☐ A copy of its annual report.

- A description of how an individual becomes a member of the organisation and retains membership in the organisation;
- A clause stating that the organisation's members will not derive any gain from the organisation, and that any profits will be used solely to promote the organisation's objectives;
- A description of the organisation's structure (i.e. President/chair, secretary, treasurer);
- A description of how the organisation elects its directors;
- The signature of the officers who adopted the incorporating documents;
- The effective date of the instrument; and
- A general dissolution clause (that addresses the winding up of the organisation); and
- A further clause (which may be contained in the by-laws):
- That, if the organisation should dissolve, provides for the distribution of the organisation's assets and property held or acquired from the proceeds of licensed lottery events (i.e. Lottery trust accounts or property purchased with lottery proceeds) to charitable organisations that are eligible to receive lottery proceeds in Ontario.
