
Housing Services Data Summary

Notes

- 1. The data contained in this data summary is updated through June 30, 2023 (Q2 2023).
- 2. All tables and graphs include data for the entire service area unless otherwise noted. The service area includes the City of Kawartha Lakes and the County of Haliburton.
- 3. Chronic homelessness means that the person or household has been experiencing homelessness for an accumulated 6 months in the past 12 months.
- 4. The City of Kawartha Lakes acknowledges that we do not have a perfect understanding of homelessness in our service area. Homelessness is very often hidden and many people and households experiencing unsheltered homelessness in rural areas especially regularly sometimes make their presence scarce. We continue to work toward better understanding the scope of homelessness in our area and how best to support and house those without somewhere safe and secure to stay.




